### **Programmes in detail:**

#### **Children Education:**



Due to changing policies in central government, support for the child care and protection programmes was routed through Hope and Help Social welfare Society. So the Stefan children's home will remain the same.

1. CTW is providing residential care services for 57 Girl children through the existing Stefan Children's Home. Among these 57 children 49 children are residing in the home as day scholars and the 8 children are studying outside. 5 children are studying Nursing and MLT courses. One child is studying polytechnic course. 6 girls are studying degree computer courses. All these girls came from remote villages. Among these 57 girls 10

children are semi orphans and the remaining are from the poorest of the poor who belongs to remote villages in Andhra Pradesh.

2. Community services, under this we have provided books and other material to 120 children in villages specially in Kolleru lake.

3. Due to changing government education policies, we stopped the Sneha English medium school from 2020-2021. We have admitted all the children in the local government schools.

4. Child Safety Net : The Child centered programme designed for the children in villages are named as Child Safety Net (CSN). This programmes was also effected with corona. No classes were promoted during this year.

### **Prevention of HIV/AIDS**



NACO and APSACS is providing financial and technical support to SNEHA in implementation of preventive activities for the migrant communities. This is an ongoing activity. The programme was initiated in the year 2008. SNEHA is implementing these programmes throughout all these years. We are implementing the prevention of HIV/AIDS among the migrant population in Krishna District. APSACS is continuing its support to implement the activities. About 15000 migrants.

All the planned programmes are successfully being implementing by SNEHA. Condom promotion is successfully implementing in the project area through the established out lets. The identified HRGs at the field level are concentrating on the follow up work. BCC activity and other planned activities are successfully implementing. Number of ICTC checkups was regular and increased according to the cases. It is observed that the people are prepared to use social marketing condoms. The medical camps, CBS (community based screening ) tests for all the identified target communities.

**COVID Activities:** With the support of Alliance India on behalf of Global fund we provided masks, sanitizers and gloves to 5,000 migrants during COVID 1<sup>st</sup> phase and second Phase. SNEHA has provided dry ration to 420 migrant families and also provided food packets to 500 migrants during 1<sup>st</sup> phase of COVID.



### **Other programmes:**

#### **COVID RELIEF:**

We have provided a provisions kit which contains 2 kegs of oil, 2kgs of wheat powder, 1kg sugar, 1kg chili powder, 1kg tamarind, 1/2 kg tamarind, 2kegs of Dall and 25kgs of rice to each family of our CTW children. We also provided the



assistance to the neighbors of these children. We provided this provision to these families for 9 months during Corona 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> wave. We have distributed 1000 masks and 500 sanitizers to the people in our adopted villages.

**AIDS awareness:**

Due to COVID effect we did not provided AIDS awareness and other programmes in our working areas.

**Skill trainings:**

Due to COVID effect we did not provided training to any one in our working areas.
