### **Programmes in detail:**

#### **Children Education:**

CTW is kind enough to continue the child Care and development project for the year 2021-2022. Hope and Help Social welfare Society remains the transferring agency for this activity. So the Stefan children's home will remain the same.



There are 59 children getting support from Stefan Children's Home. Among these 59 children, 49 children are residing in the children's home and the remaining 10 children are studying outside. 4 children are studying Nursing and MLT courses. One child is studying polytechnic course. 5 girls are studying degree computer courses.

All these girls came from remote villages. Among these 59 girls 2 children are semi orphans and the remaining are from the poorest of the poor who belongs to remote villages in Andhra Pradesh.

2. Community services: Under this activity, we have provided books, bags and other material to 241 children in villages especially in Kolleru lake.

### **Prevention of HIV/AIDS**

NACO is continuing its support to SNEHA through APSACS. The designed Programmes for the migrant population are being properly implementing by SNEHA. APSACS is also providing technical support to SNEHA.

SNEHA is implementing these programmes throughout the previous 12 years. We are implementing the prevention of HIV/AIDS among the migrant population in 6 mandals of Krishna District. Target for this year is 10000 migrants.



All the planned programmes are successfully being implementing by SNEHA. Condom promotion is successfully implementing in the project area through the established 34 out lets. The identified HRGs at the field level are concentrating on the follow up work. BCC activity and other planned activities are successfully implementing. Number of ICTC checkups was regular and increased according to the cases. It is observed that the people are prepared to use social marketing condoms. The medical camps, CBS (community based screening ) tests for all the identified target communities.

**Medical Camps:** We have organized medical camps in 15 villages. Organized medical camps for Diabetic persons and pregnant women. About 210 diabetics persons were tested and provided with medicines. Around 12 pregnant women were tested and provided with medicines. Government medical and health department and local ICDS employees participated in the camps.



### **Skill trainings:**

SNEHA has implemented the skill training for 16 groups in tailoring and embroidery, pappad making, candle making and pickle making. 480 women and adolescent girls was trained.

Some of these trainees are established their own units. Women belongs to all communities getting benefitted.

We also provided them to get the loans from the local banks. 5 women availed the loan and established the units. They provided employment to other trained adolescent girls.
