### Programmes in detail:

#### Children Education:



SNEHA took the responsibility to implement the child care homes in 10 places during the year 2022-23 covering around 522 children supported by CTW, Germany. Among these, there are 350 Girls and 200 boys. We are providing residential care for 450 children and Extended Foster ship Grant to 150 children. Children from 2<sup>nd</sup> class to professional courses are getting benefitted from CTW support.



These 10 homes are located in 10 different places. Each home is being taken care of a warden and three other required staff members. All these children are studying in Government schools and colleges. Very few are studying in private colleges.

SNEHA is providing Quality food, medical support, required books, Transportation facilities

to the school going and college going children, Skill training for the eligible children and support to purchase machinery. All the staff members are very committed towards their work. They are fully concentrating on the welfare and development of the children,

We have provided required books, writing pads and other material to 180 children in villages specially in Kolleru lake.

### **Prevention of HIV/AIDS**

NACO through APSACS is providing financial and technical support to SNEHA TI in implementation of preventive activities for the migrant communities. This is an ongoing activity. The programme was initiated in the year 2008. The programme is being extended for 2 more years from 2023-2024.



SNEHA is implementing prevention of HIV/AIDS activities among the migrant population in six mandals in N.T.R. District. The target for the coming 2 years is also for 15000 migrants. DAPCU and District medical and Health department is providing guidance and necessary support in implementation of the planned

activities. Main activities of the programme is conducting medical camps ,CBS (Community based screening) tests to detect the cases, organizing events and demonstration events, blood donation camps, establishment and maintenance of 36 hot spots in different places. Condom promotion through these hot spots and local medical shops.

We are concentrating on the follow up activities for the identified HRGs at the field level. BCC activity and other planned activities are successfully implementing. Number of ICTC checkups was regular and increased according to the cases. It is observed that the people are prepared to use social marketing condoms.

### **AIDS awareness:**

We have organized the AIDS awareness camps in 15 villages, 78 schools and 4 colleges in Kaikalur sub-Division of Eluru District. Local PHC staff, teaching staff extended their cooperation in organizing the camps.



**Jal Jeevan Mission:** This is the programme designed and implementing by the Central and State Governments to provide drinking water to every family through the provision of individual tap connections. They identified SNEHA as the ISA (Implementing Support Agency) for 2 sub-Divisions (Gudivada and Kaikalur). We are implementing the activities in 420 villages in 7 mandals with the support and cooperation of RWS&S Government of A.P.



Main activities of the programme includes, to prepare the people in villages to accept and involve in the **Har Ghar Gel** programmes planned and implementing by RWS&S. Organizing the village level Gram sabha's, providing trainings to (VWSC'S)Village Water and Sanitation Committees, organizing mass meetings in villages. Organizing motivational sessions and demonstrations to the school children on the importance of safe drinking

water, how to protect the water sources, importance of sanitation in the villages, conducting PRA's. Motivation of villagers on the importance of maintaining the O&M account for the smooth running of the water connections. So we are extending our support to the District RWS officials in the programme implementation.
